From the Principal

Almost half of the term has already passed – it's hard to believe how quickly time seems to go by, and, as always, so much is happening at Bellingen High School.

Year 7 parents will receive a phone call from a core classroom teacher this week to ask how your student is settling in and if there is anything we should be aware of or can do to assist in this process – and this information will be relayed to relevant staff so that appropriate action



can be taken. Year 7 have already undertaken Best Start which is a State-wide assessment, a SENA Maths test and a Renaissance reading test. These have assisted us to look at current class placements and who needs extra support, especially in Literacy and Numeracy. We will be using staff (Ms Pinder, Ms McGregor and Ms Riley) to withdraw students who require the most support using the government funding supplied relating to CoVid catch up.

There has been a lot of maintenance work undertaken this last month around the school. It's nearing completion and we are grateful to students, staff and parents for their patience. In an old school, as the school gets older, many working parts fall into disrepair and need maintenance. The overall look – painting etc. – is just lipstick and mascara on the 'old girl' to spruce her up and make the learning environment – both classrooms and grounds – more appealing for all who use them. The rain has slowed this process down somewhat.

As a whole school focus for Term 1, there will be a focus on Waste Management and Language Use. Our grounds are lovely – we are lucky to have the sprawling grounds we do but it is unfortunate when students buy noodle cups or icy cups at the canteen and spread some of the rubbish associated with both of those products over the grounds. We have plenty of bins for this – there is no need to litter. There is a minority of students responsible for this – but it affects the whole school learning community and the wider community who use the grounds in the afternoon – for training or BYO practice or those who use it on the weekend – church groups; craft groups etc. The same can be said of poor language used by students – from simple salutations to manners and general courtesy. Manners and courtesy cost nothing but go such a long way to make a mark on the social culture of an environment or a community, as well as leaving an indelible impression about a person's character and inherent values. We will address these as school concerns in the weeks following, I would

really appreciate conversations about these matters at home, if you think appropriate, to raise student awareness and allow them time to consider what we are saying before the date.

Our focus this fortnight is on Teaching and Learning and Assessment, asking students to consider goals for their 2021 academic journey and to ensure that they give 100% to their work. We made plain our expectations relating to submission timeframes and ensuring that the best work is produced and submitted, re-iterating repeatedly that 'near enough is not good enough' and that a draft is just that. Drafts of tasks can be given to teachers for annotation to improve the work before submission and students should look at the feedback on returned tasks and ask how to improve and grow for future tasks. Sometimes, all it takes is the first time of asking for a pattern of improvement to be formed. Years 8, 9 and 10 will undertake their goal setting interviews this upcoming week. We look forward to seeing what they come up with.

More than 12 months ago Year 10 student Deja Barlow made the decision to grow her hair with a view to shaving and donating it to make wigs for children with cancer.





BELLINGEN HIGH SCHOOL UNIFORM

Bellingen High School asks all parents to send their children to school neatly dressed in correct uniform. Every student should take pride in their appearance and the wearing of school uniform is an important step in developing a good school spirit.

The Bellingen High School uniform has been agreed on following extensive community consultation and is supported by the P&C, Student Representative Council and Staff. It is expected that students will be in full school uniform at all times unless they are involved in an approved activity that does not require the uniform to be worn.

Students who have approval to be out of uniform are required to comply with the dress code that includes being neat and tidy with shirts that have a collar and sleeves. Fully enclosed shoes are to be worn at all times. The following items are unacceptable – ripped clothing, singlets, string shoulder tops as shirts, sleeveless shirts, low cut necklines or armholes, midriff tops, jumpers with hoods and slogan pictures.

The wearing of uniform is school policy at Bellingen High School. School uniform provides students with a sense of connection to the school. In a school like Bellingen, it also gives identity to the student body in a school which has students from varying levels of socioeconomic backgrounds.

Students are not permitted to participate in extracurricular (non-compulsory) activities such as sporting representation or excursions if they have not made a genuine effort to wear school uniform. Parents can approach the school for assistance in this area if required. Please ring the Front Office to find out more.

To encourage uniform wearing we have: -

- 1. A commitment from the staff both encouraging students and acting in a supervisory role.
- 2. P&C support.
- 3. A support network with parents.
- 4. A supporting statement from the SRC in relation to uniforms.

Parents can purchase and have embroidered cotton shirts for students who have an adverse reaction to the fabrics used in the uniform. Hopefully (reliant on delivery), we will have a sample of hemp shirts for \$30 available which look the same as those from Lowes.

- Black or single coloured <u>leather upper shoes</u>,

Note: Shorts and skirts are to be not more than 10 centimetres from the knee.

NO jeans – shorts or jeans of ANY description or colour.

Footwear:

Establishing and maintaining safe working environments is fundamental to the work of teachers and students. Footwear is an important safety item. Good soles provide a sound grip on the floor preventing accidents from occurring. Footwear can also protect feet from mechanical or chemical damage.

Department of Education policy clearly states that it is mandatory that students carrying out practical activities using chemicals or equipment in schools wear <u>enclosed leather</u> footwear. This includes all Science, Industrial Arts and Home Economics classes. Our commercial stainless steel kitchen is in operation and no student will be allowed in without leather footwear.

Students who attend school with inappropriate footwear (e.g. thongs, crocs, scuffs slip-on sandals without a strap, high heels, ugg boots or slippers) may be isolated from practical classes, or sent home to get footwear that is more appropriate. In all cases, it is best for students to have an explanatory note from home **AND** report to the Deputy Principal's office **before** school to get a Uniform Slip.
