Tell Them From Me Survey

At the commence of Term 2, Bellingen High School is taking part in the *Tell Them From Me* student survey. The survey will provide us with valuable feedback on what our students think about school life, how engaged they are with school and the different ways that teachers interact with them. Schools in Australia and around the world have used the *Tell Them From Me* survey to help them improve. The survey is completed online and is run by an independent research company, **The Learning Bar** which specialises in school-based surveys.

Staff in schools will <u>not</u> be able to identify individual students from their responses. To ensure confidentiality, participating students will receive a unique username and password. Where fewer than five students respond to a question, the results will be suppressed. The survey typically takes 30 minutes or less to complete and will be administered by the school during normal school hours. Once the surveys are completed by students, reports are prepared and in most cases are available to schools within three business days.

As well as schools getting student feedback, the Department of Education, through the Centre for Education Statistics and Evaluation (CESE), has access to data from across NSW and is running a research project to look at state-wide patterns of student wellbeing, engagement and effective teaching practices. The research is looking at how these things impact on student outcomes, including academic performance. Individual students will not be identified in any CESE publications, and all information will be handled in accordance with the relevant privacy legislation. Students' personal information will <u>not</u> be disclosed by the department to any other person or body other than as required by law.

This research will help schools in New South Wales to better understand how to improve student wellbeing and engagement. It will also help teachers and principals discuss what works to improve student outcomes.

Participating in the survey is entirely voluntary. Your child will not take part if either you or your child do not wish. If, during the survey, your child is uncomfortable, he/she can choose to stop the survey at any time. The majority of questions in the survey can be skipped.

If you <u>do not want your child to take part</u> in the survey, please contact the school before the end of this term.

Year 11 News Supporting our Students

Mr. Neville will be helping students develop a range of study skills and access HSC support material such as the EDROLO resources. At Bellingen High we work with each student individually to maximise their success in the HSC and Mr. Neville and Mrs. Gorman have already begun helping individuals with planning and organisation to help them manage the pressures of Senior School.



Homework Club and Study Room

This year we have continued to develop the dedicated Senior Study as a space, annexed to the library, for students to work individually or collaboratively on assignments, homework and study plans. This quiet work space has a calendar of senior assessment tasks so students can plan for the term ahead as well as a range of resources for our seniors to access. Senior Google Classrooms were also opened this week and these online spaces will deliver extra material to help with planning, note taking, revision, exam techniques and careers advice at relevant points in Year 11 and 12.

Extra support is also available each Tuesday afternoon after school. Seniors can join the homework club running in the Library from 3.30pm to 5.30pm. It is a great opportunity for students to collaborate with their peers to resolve homework problems or to get ahead with assignments!

Trial of Salvanote (Mobile App)

During Term 1 this year, Bellingen High School will be trialling an educational mobile app to make it much easier for teachers to be in more frequent communication with parents of children in their care. The school will invite a number of parents to participate in this trial. At the conclusion of the trial, all participating parents and staff will be asked, in a survey, to tell the school what they thought about the mobile app. At that time, the Principal will decide whether or not to employ this app to promote better and more frequent communication with parents. During the trial, participating parents are encouraged to bring any questions or any feedback to the staff contact person, Mr. Jeff Borg, in the Mathematics Department.

Therefore, in the coming weeks **some** parents will be offered the opportunity to download the mobile app (called Salvanote) to their Android or Apple mobile phone. The app will have easy to follow instructions on how to sign up. The use of the app will be very similar to other communication apps like WhatsApp or Messenger. Some staff have volunteered to be a part of this trial with specific classes or groups of students – so not all teachers or all classes will have access during the trial period.

The app is free to download and free to use, with the only cost being the indirect cost of data. This cost is negligible, especially during the trial, when messaging via Salvanote is text-based. If you already use WhatsApp/Messenger/Telegram, etc., then you will be familiar with this kind of data usage. The app will not use SMS functionality on your phone.

So keep posted. Salvanote is coming!

NB 'Salva' is from Latin with various shades of meaning. We have chosen 'safe' as the meaning we prefer. 'Note' is self-explanatory about communication, especially in written form. So the name Salvanote has a background in meaning as "safe communications". So the name emphasizes the importance of the messages being encrypted.

^{*}There will be a number of Year 8 students that started Gardasil in Year 7 in 2020 that will need to complete the 2 dose schedule this year.

Important issues about the program this year:

- Gardasil (HPV) is now a 2 x dose schedule (6 months interval) and will only be available as a school based program to Year 7 students. Year 8 students who commenced their vaccination in Year 7 at school and did not complete the course will be offered a catch up during 2021.
- **Boostrix** is available to Year 7 students and Year 8 as a catch up. It is a single dose.
- Nimenrix (Meningococcal ACWY) is available to Year 10 students and Year 11 as a catch up. It is a single dose.
- To improve vaccination completion, students will be opportunistically offered any missed doses throughout the year where possible. Parents will receive a letter or text at the end of the year from NSW Health if their child has not completed the vaccination program.

Parent information kits and consent forms have been distributed to parents. If your child did not receive a form, spare ones are available from the office.

VACCINATIONS AT SCHOOL





What's first?

A nurse will shortly call you over for your vaccinations,

Your nurse will ask you a few questions to confirm your identity as written on your signed consent form, such as:

- > Your name
- > Date of birth
- > Home address

2 What's next?

Your nurse will then ask you questions about your health:

- > Are you feeling well today?
- > Do you have any allergies or any past reactions to vaccines?
- > Have you received any vaccines in the last 12 months?
- > And for female students only: Are you pregnant or do you think you might be pregnant? (This may seem a silly question, but some vaccines should not be given during pregnancy.)

Your nurse will explain what vaccine/s you will receive today

But does it hurt?

Your nurse will describe:

- > What you may feel
- > How best you can relax your arm and
- > Tips on how to distract yourself
- Afterwards you can tell the nurse how it felt

Congratulations - You did it!

- > Sit with your nurse while a record > Eat and drink well during the day of your vaccination is completed (should only take a minute)
- > Join your class mates sitting quietly in the recovery area for 15 minutes before returning to class
- > Tell a nurse or teacher if you're feeling unwell
- > Support your fellow class mates
- > Give your parent/guardian your Record of Vaccination card.
- > Remember to keep moving your arm/s throughout the day
- > See you next time!

HEALTH INFORMATION

In most instances, unless you give permission, health workers cannot share your health information, however there are a few situations where we might need to talk to other people. For example if we have any concerns about your safety, welfare or wellbeing.


From the Science Faculty Year 9 Electronics

We look forward to welcoming the Orama students into the Bellingen High School










Library News World Book Day

On Friday April 23 Bellingen High School is celebrating World Book Day. This event was created on 23 April 1995, by the United Nations Educational, Scientific and Cultural Organization (UNESCO). The connection between that date and books, however, was made in Spain in 1923, as it is the anniversary of the death of William Shakespeare and Inca Garcilaso de la Vega, prominent Spanish Chronicler.



There were a few ideas for the day of the

year that World Book Day should be held. Originally, Vicente Clavel Andrés, a Valencian writer, suggested that the day should be on a day that honored the author Miguel de Cervantes. This would be either his birthday, October 7, or his death date, April 23. The latter date is the one that was chosen because it was also the date that William Shakespeare died and when Inca Garcilaso de la Vega died too. In fact, several other prominent authors have also died on April 23 – perhaps authors should be wary of this date!

Dress up or donate a book and change lives.

So on the first Friday of Term 2 students can donate either a brand new or a secondhand book. They will be collected in the library. Thanks to people who fundraised on World Book Day 2020, last year 47 335 books were sent to communities around the world who need them most **OR** students can dress as a favourite book character and donate a gold coin.

Year 12 Primary Industries

The class is working at a fast pace and nearly completed the necessary practical work. The focus is now on organising work placement, completing the last clusters and finally, preparing to score well in the 2021 HSC Primary Industries Examination.

Year 11 Primary Industries

Most students have completed the Safety Cluster. They must complete 7 more clusters before earning a Certificate II in Agriculture. The class will now concentrate on the Healthy Livestock Cluster, which will take nearly to the end of Term 2 to complete.

Year 10 Agriculture

This term the focus is on training the young Red Poll cattle to lead. All going well, so far.

Soon the students will start mulching, seeding and fertilizing their paddocks, ensuring there is enough winter feed for the cattle. All the students have earned their tractor licences and will use the tractor, mulcher and spreader to plant the 2021 Rye Grass crop.

The gardens are planted with a wide range of seedlings. Year 10 will also participate in the Great Pea Challenge. Each student will strive to produce the perfect pea, and become famous at the Coffs Harbour and Bellingen Shows.





Year 9 Agriculture

Everyone has been kept very busy feeding the poddy calves twice a day, ensuring they stayed healthy during the recent difficult weather conditions. The feeding process involves catching the calves, tying them up, mixing the milk, feeding, washing up, moving them to their paddock and filling the hay net and pellet feeder.









A big thank you to Gary Eichmann for providing the lovely calves, and paying for their feed while they are on the school farm.

The students have also prepared and planted their raised garden. Year 9 will focus on growing the perfect radish, while learning about sowing depth, plant spacing and time of planting. They have also planted a wide variety of vegetables that are planned to be entered into the Bellingen and Coffs Harbour Shows.



The next schools tennis opportunity is coming up in a few months, when the North Coast selects the boys and girls teams for the State Tennis Teams event.


