










Riverwatch Canoe Fieldtrip

After a year of studying the Bellinger River Catchment, the Year 9 Riverwatch Elective class undertook a canoe trip from Gordonville Crossing to Lavenders Bridge, a distance of about ten kilometres.

We spent the day on the river taking note of the health of the water, the state of the riverbanks and the need for riparian vegetation. The river had a steady flow but had dropped substantially after a few dry weeks. One obvious feature was the clarity of the water and temperature drop when we paddled into the junction of the Never River (below).

Down at the Ag Plot Dorrigo Show

Friday 25th and Saturday 26th November saw the Bellingen High School Cattle Team attend the Dorrigo Show. The 20 strong team exhibited animals from the school's very own Bell-Hy Red Poll Stud, Belarosa Red Poll Stud and we can't forget Amanda Lockman's little Jersey-cross poddy calves you might have seen around the school!

Having recently attended the North Coast National a few weeks earlier, the team were well drilled with all cattle being washed and prepared in time for junior judging and junior parading on Friday afternoon. In these events, the students themselves are assessed on their parading and cattle judging. These events are an important inclusion at agricultural shows as they offer young people the opportunity to learn and become part of the show scene long term. All our students participated in these categories with six students placing in the finals for junior judging and one third place for the 14-16 age group, Juliet Ryan, at her very first show!

The cattle classes started soon after the junior categories with the school's competition on the Saturday afternoon. Bellingen High entered a total of 14 animals, the largest number for any school entrant. This competition involved points being awarded for the preparation and presentation of the animals. Congratulations to Abbi Sheridan and Eibhlin Kealy-Banks who placed third for their work with Belarosa Sophie.

Saturday saw the commencement of the pure-bred cattle section. The large school farm at Bellingen High provides the physical space to maintain the Bell-Hy Red Poll Stud, which allows us to participate in this part of the competition. The team also exhibited stock from the Belarosa Red Poll Stud, giving plenty of opportunities for team members to practice their parading skills. The following animals placed in the pure-bred classes:

- Red Poll Female 12 and under 16 months: Belrosa Sonya
- Red Poll Female 16 and under 20 months: Bell-Hy Strawberry
- Red Poll Female 30+ months: Bell-Hy Quinoa
- Square Meater Champion Female: Maryvale Rona

Busways Getting to school by bus in 2023

Will your child be catching the bus to school in 2023? Applications are now open for a Bus Travel Pass. As it's a busy time of year, we highly recommend you make this application before the end of Term 4. It's also good to check the bus timetable to make your child's journey to school as easy as possible.

Here is how it works:

Bus passes

All students catching the bus in 2023 will need a school travel pass.

Under the School Student Transport Scheme, eligible students can apply for free or subsided travel between home and school.

For more information about the School Student Transport Scheme and how to apply for a school travel pass, visit <u>https://apps.transport.nsw.gov.au/ssts/#/</u> from a desktop computer. Applications for 2023 opened at the start of Term 4.

Bus timetables

Busways is the school bus operator that runs your schools' bus services. To find your child's school bus timetable visit the Busways website by using the following steps:

- 1. Go to busways.com.au/nsw
- 2. Click on 'school services' in the navigation bar and then proceed to 'school timetables'
- 3. Enter the school's name in the field that says 'enter a school name'
- Select the school's name and the timetable should open on your device. If you are unable to find or search for the school's name, use the drop-down menus on the same web page to find the school.
- 5. Once the timetable is opened, you will be able to identify which school bus services are available in your area for your child to use.

School Bus Service Interruptions

Due to the upcoming roadworks on Freshwater Creek bridge, Old Coast Road – Repton, there will be a change to **School Bus S336** and **School Bus S265**. Commencing **Monday 28 November 2022**, the bus will operate the following route and times.

These diversions will omit Old Coast Road between Overhead Bridge Road and Perrys Road.

Services will return to normal from Day 1 Term 1 2023.

School Bus S265 – AM Service

School Bus S265 will depart from McCabes Road (Bundagen Gate) at 7.30am (10 minutes earlier) via McCabes Road, Overhead Bridge Road, **left Pine Creek Way, Keevers Drive, left Perrys Road**, Tuckers Rock Road, Forest Drive to the Repton Fire Shed for the transfer to School Bus S272 or School Bus S285.

School Bus S336 – PM Service

School Bus S336 will depart from Repton Public School at 3:25pm and operate current route and times to Repton Fire Shed to accept transfers from School Bus S329 and School Bus S369. Then School Bus S336 will operate via Forest Drive, Tuckers Rock Road, Perrys Road, right Keevers Drive, Pine Creek Way, right Overhead Bridge Road, right McCabe Road to Bundagen Gate (4:09pm).
